Great Ideas For Teaching Students (GIFTS) provides an excellent opportunity for faculty members and/or graduate students to share classroom-tested "great ideas" with other educators. In alignment with the conference theme, submissions are encouraged which promote reflection, examination, celebration, and/or reimagination of Communication scholarship and/or pedagogy and the discipline's unique positioning for addressing contemporary issues.

Submissions may present an activity, assignment, project, game, simulation, etc. for exploring a specific communication theory, concept, skill, or learning objective.

The GIFTS Presentation

A GIFTS presentation is a concise depiction of a specific, focused teaching idea that can be explained or demonstrated in 6-8 minutes. Presenters should be prepared with a brief, comprehensive handout for interested participants (or a "screen share" in the event of a hybrid conference). Submitters are reminded the most valuable GIFTS are those which include a clear and succinct "how-to" approach. There will be limited, but basic, access to audio/visual equipment for in-person presentations.

Submission Guidelines

Please submit a <u>one-paragraph abstract</u> of your "great idea" as well as a <u>1-2 page description of</u> <u>the activity itself</u>. This proposal should include your **goal**, **rationale**, **directions**, **explanations**, and the typical **results**. Submissions should include the submitter's name, institutional affiliation, email address, and telephone number.

A statement of professional responsibility should be included with the submission stating the following: "In submitting the attached proposal, I/we agree to present at the 2022 NYSCA conference if it is accepted. I/we further recognize that all who attend and present at NYSCA's annual meeting must register and pay the required fees."

Conference planners continue to closely monitor the COVID-19 pandemic. We are currently optimistic that an in-person conference will be viable by October 2022. Such a conference will include adherence to local and state health guidelines for health and safety.
