Proposals for papers, creative presentations, and panels are invited from both members and non-members of NYSCA. Work related to the conference theme is encouraged, as well as a wide range of topics concerning communication. All submissions should be in the form of a 200-word abstract: proposals for papers, creative presentations, demonstration projects and panels. The panel organizer should submit a statement describing the session topic, abstracts for each paper or presentation in the panel and indicate that each author is willing to participate in the session. The submission deadline for abstracts and panel proposals is June 15, 2003.

Graduate students are strongly encouraged to submit paper proposals. They should note their student status with submission in order to be considered for a special Student Award, and send their completed paper by September 15, 2003.
